
FirstEnergy Ohio Energy Efficiency Programs

- In Response to Ohio Senate Bill 221
 - Utilities mandated to achieve annual energy reductions growing to over 22% by 2025
- Incentives for Installing Energy Conservation Measures
- C/I Program Opportunities
 - Mercantile Self-Directed
 - Incentives/Rebates for Energy Efficiency Projects
- Programs are subject to approval by the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio (PUCO)

Mercantile Customer Program (Completed Projects)

Mercantile customers may qualify to avoid certain charges in the Demand Side Management and Energy Efficiency Rider (DSE2) or may opt for a cash option

- Who is considered "mercantile"?
 - A "mercantile customer" is a commercial or industrial customer if the electricity consumed is for nonresidential use and the customer consumes more than 700,000 kWh per year or is part of a national account involving multiple facilities in one or more states
- Minimum energy efficiency saving requirements per the DSE2 Rider
 - Energy savings and/or peak demand reductions from customer's self-directed projects equal to or greater than the statutory benchmarks to which the Company is subject
- If Customer elects cash rebate in lieu of exemption, based on 75% of current program incentives, capped at 50% of project cost or \$250k per project or \$500k per customer per FE operating company (CEI, OEC, TEC)
- Customer commits either existing or new energy savings to the Utility's compliance requirements through an application filed to PUCO
- PUCO has final approval authority



Mercantile Program Project Eligibility

- Energy Efficiency is defined as those that "reduce the consumption of energy while maintaining or improving level of functionality"
- Examples are lighting projects, custom process retrofits, behavioral changes if they can be measured & verified, and if an investment was made
- Timeline for projects: Projects must be implemented during the prior 3 calendar years or later
